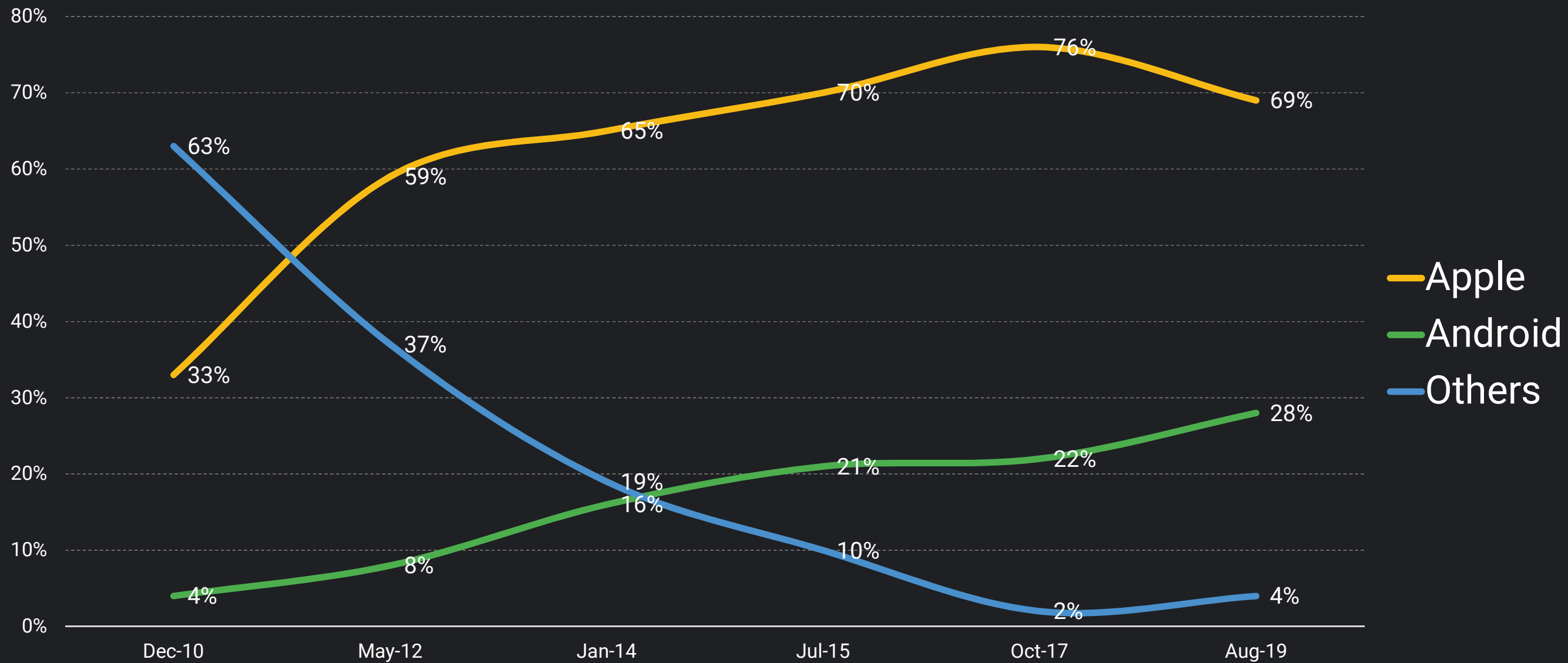
# Screen reader users prefer Apple (August 2019)
