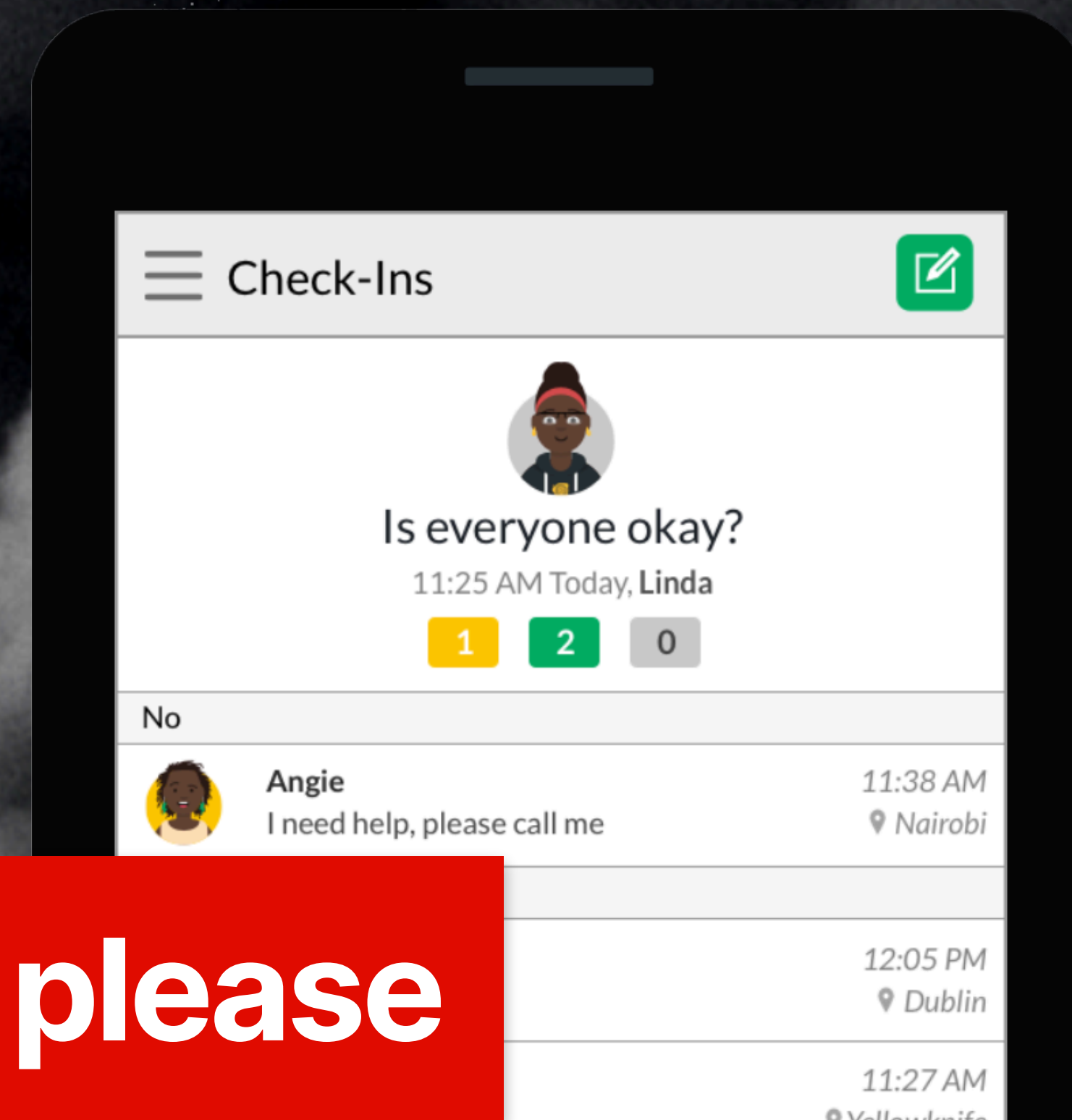
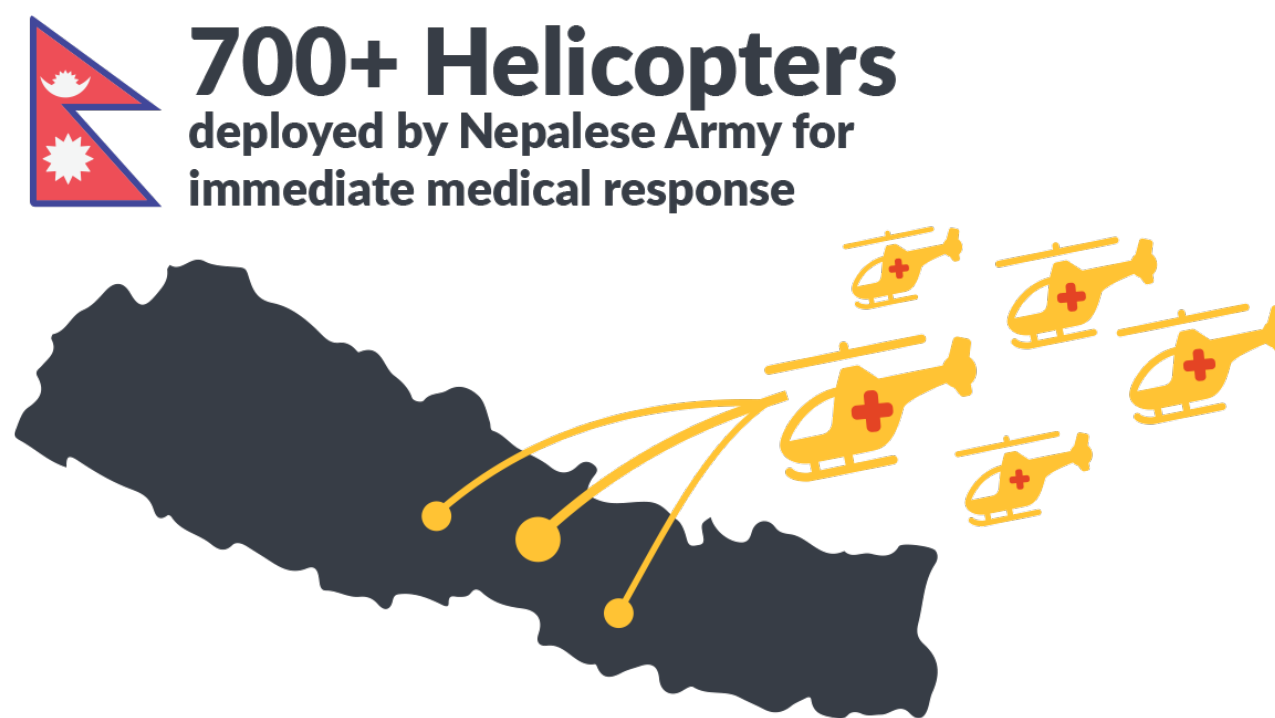
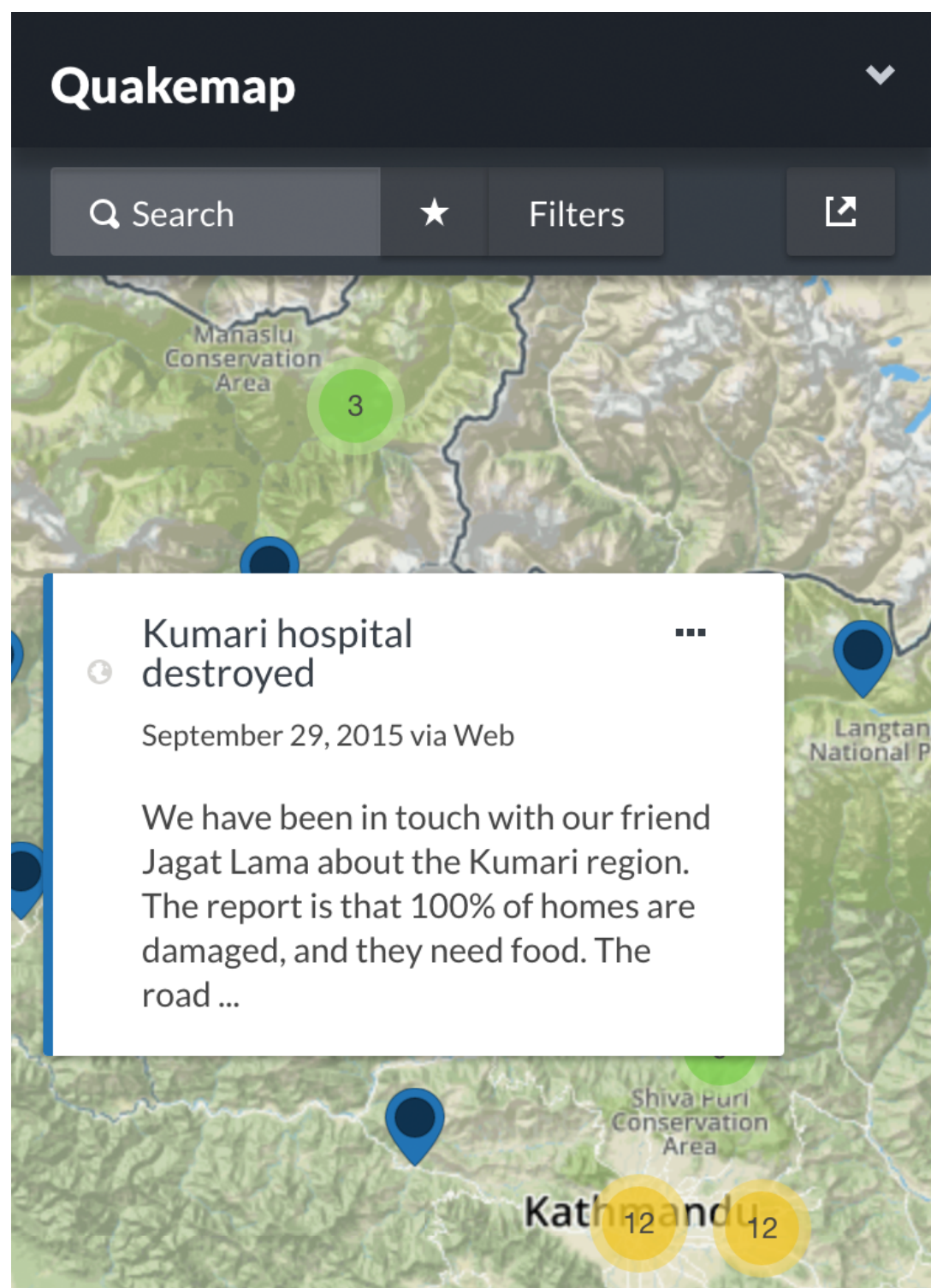
Helping people raise their voice and those who serve them to listen and respond better

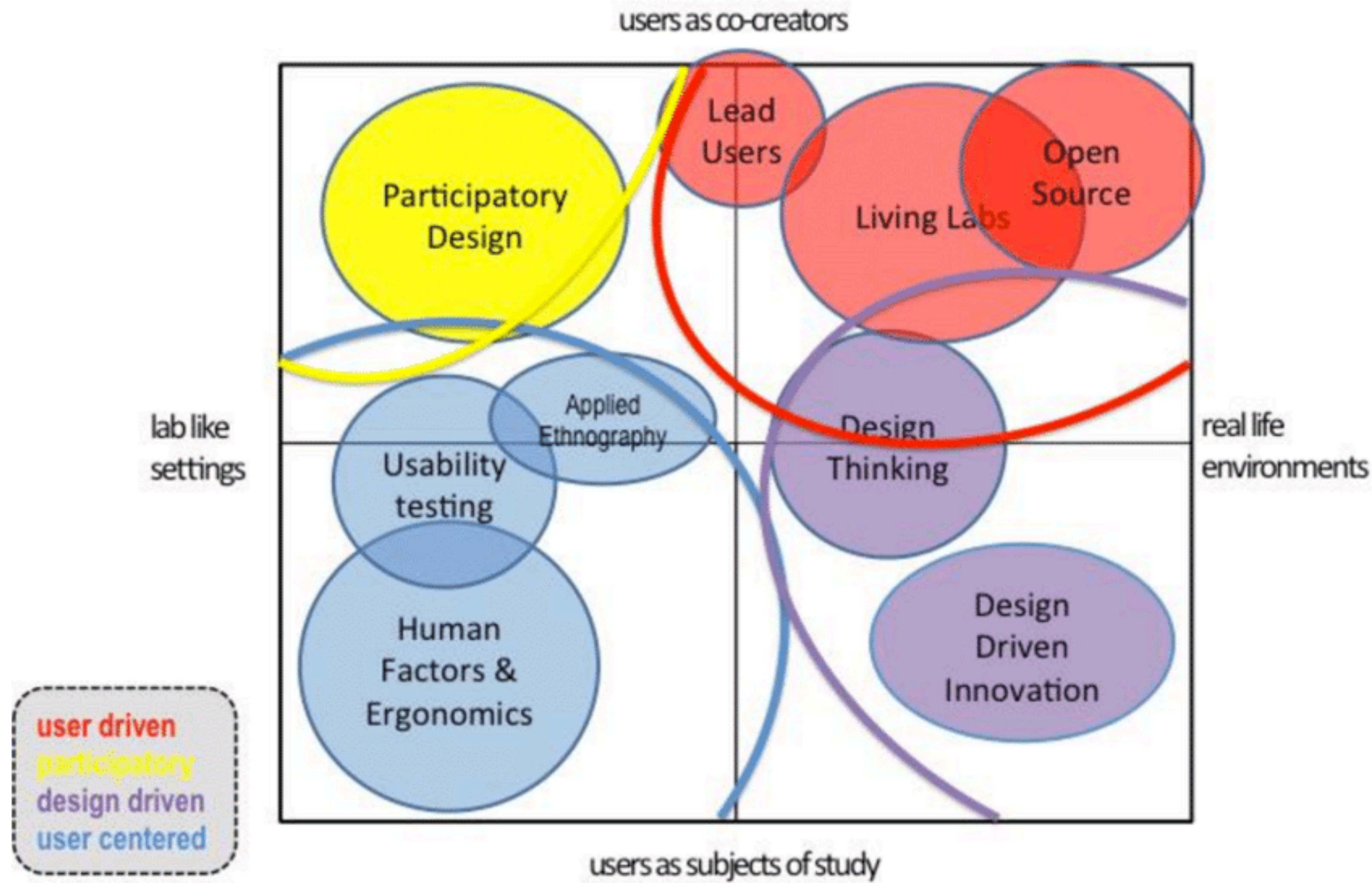
Grant funded activity is...
