



Whenever I had to take standardized tests in high school, I would get anxious over the easiest part: filling out my name.

- A kiosk fails and there's no offline process for completing the transaction in real-time.
- Microcopy asked binary questions that negate personhood.
- Forms failing to account for things like names don't fit a narrow conception of what we think they should.
- Apps that assuming relationship status or holidays you celebrate because "everyone else" does.
- "It's a bummer the implementation looks completely different than what we designed."


