MANUAL: ZOOM

When you zoom in (up to 400%),
does everything still work?

- text should not overlap
- text should not be cut off
- all controls should be usable
- no horizontal and vertical scrolling



MANUAL: SCREENREADERS

Use the website with a
screenreader, *but*

- if you're not a regular screenreader user, add a pinch of salt, don't jump to conclusions
- keep common browser/screenreader combinations in mind
- “it works” also depends on user skill, not all users are tech savvy

SEMI-AUTOMATED TESTING

Tests that remove some of the manual work so you can make decisions quicker

ACT Rules can be implemented in automated test tools and test methodologies. Tools and methodologies based on the same set of rules will produce (largely) the same results. Each rule includes a number of test cases that are used to check if an implementation is correct. The ACT Rules Community keeps a list of implementations that are actively implementing ACT Rules. By comparing how many implementations rules have, we work out which rules are widely agreed upon, and which ones need further discussion.
