

New Community Members


- 1. Lean on our Local Drupal Communities (Camps, User Groups, etc.)



The problem & our solution

The Problem

- Entry-level Drupal jobs require experience
- New talent can't break in
- Companies train people who get hired away

Our Solution: IXP

- Companies hire inexperienced developers
- Provide mentorship (1 hour per 10 worked)
- Organizations earn 250 contribution credits
- Newcomers get real paid experience



How It Actually Works

For companies: Post on jobs.drupal.org/ixp-developer-hub

For developers: Apply for IXP-specific positions

- Both track progress on https://drupal-ixp.site
- Minimum 160 hours paid work
- Blog post + 3 contributions required

What is the Event Platform?


 A set of modules that simplify the website setup for a Drupalcamp (or similar event)

Content Architecture Includes

- Sponsors
- Job Listings
- Featured Speakers

Functional Enhancements

- Generate Time Slots
- Drag-and-Drop Scheduler
- Rate Sessions (new!)
- Bulk Moderate Sessions (new!)


Vision:

1.0 (MVP) Scope:


- Initially targeting Drupal User Groups / local associations

The Drupal Open University initiative is a community-driven project focused on bringing Drupal into the academic world.

Our mission is to introduce students to the power of Drupal and foster the next generation of Drupal developers.

Challenges:

- We need new talent for Drupal
- PHP is overlooked by students, teachers and Universities
- Open Source is pushed by Governments
- We need attention and love from outside of our Drupal
 Community
- There are people already teaching Drupal at Universities


