



I am worried about the **perception** of coding...




Learning obstacles

content-type warns against not serving resources with the Content-Type HTTP response header with a value containing the appropriate media type and charset for the response.

Why is this important? 💊

Even though browsers sometimes ignore the value of the Content-Type header and try to sniff the content, it's indicated to always send the appropriate media type and charset for the response as, among other:

- resources served with the wrong media type may be blocked (see also: X-Content-Type-Options hint), or the official media type may be required
- not sending the appropriate charset, where appropriate, may prevent things from being rendered correctly thus creating a bad user experience (see also: metacharset-utf-8 hint)






Hinting during deployment

- A web interface to get reports doesn't scale to production
- Why not install hinting at as part of your build/deployment process?
- That way you can also test the setup of your bundler/preprocessor to avoid huge release sizes
