A Spices Park was established under the Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode in Yadlapadu Mandal on the Guntur-Chilakaluripet highway. A research station to be set up on the same premises would conduct research on high-yielding and disease-resistant varieties of Chilies and turmeric, quality upgradation, and development of new species.
