THE BIG SEVEN

THE LAND GIANTS

The traditional **Big Five** includes the Lion, Leopard, Elephant, Rhino, and Cape Buffalo. Originally named by hunters for being the most dangerous to track on foot, they are now symbols of conservation.

THE MARINE ADDITIONS

South Africa is unique for adding two majestic sea creatures to the list: the **Great White Shark** and the **Southern Right Whale**. This expansion reflects the country's rich biodiversity across both land and sea.



ICONIC LAND GIANTS



The Lion & Leopard

The Lion, king of the savanna, lives in social prides, while the elusive Leopard is a solitary master of stealth and camouflage.

The African Elephant

Highly intelligent giants with deep social bonds, led by a matriarch who holds the herd's collective memory.

The Rhinoceros

Ancient and powerful, both White and Black rhinos are the focus of intense global conservation efforts.

The Cape Buffalo

Known as the "Black Death" for its strength, the buffalo is famous for its protective and formidable herd behavior.

MARINE GIANTS

GREAT WHITE SHARK

The Apex Predator

South Africa is world-renowned for its Great White populations. These formidable hunters are best observed in the nutrient-rich waters of False Bay and Gansbaai.

Best Viewing

Peak season occurs from June to November when they congregate around seal colonies for hunting.

SOUTHERN RIGHT WHALE

The Coastal Giant

Migrating from Antarctica, these gentle giants visit the Cape coast to mate and calve in sheltered bays like Hermanus.

Unique Behavior

Known for "tail sailing" and breaching, they offer the world's best land-based whale watching from June to December.

THE "OTHER" FIVES

The Small Five

Elephant Shrew, Leopard Tortoise, Antlion, Rhinoceros Beetle, Buffalo Weaver.

Tiny wonders that mirror their larger namesakes in spirit and form.

The Shy Five

Porcupine, Bat-eared Fox, Aardvark, Meerkat, Aardwolf.

Elusive nocturnal specialists that require patience and luck to spot.



The Ugly Five

Warthog, Wildebeest, Vulture, Marabou Stork, Hyena.

Proving that beauty is functional; these animals are vital to the ecosystem.

The Impossible Five

Aardvark, Caracal, Pangolin, African Wild Dog, Serval.

The ultimate challenge for the most seasoned safari enthusiasts.

KRUGER NATIONAL PARK: THE CROWN JEWEL

DIVERSE DESTINATIONS

Addo Elephant Park

A sanctuary for over 600 elephants and the only place to see the **Big Seven**. It spans from dense bush to the coastal waters of the Eastern Cape.

Kgalagadi Transfrontier

A world of red dunes and vast salt pans. Famous for its **black-maned Kalahari lions** and spectacular predator sightings in a semi-arid wilderness.

Hluhluwe-iMfolozi

The **Cradle of the Rhino**, instrumental in saving the species from extinction. It offers a rugged landscape and rich Zulu heritage.

Pilanesberg National Park

Set within an **ancient volcanic crater**, this malaria-free Big Five destination is an ecological transition zone with unique biodiversity.

BEST TIME TO VISIT

Dry Season (May – Sept)

The classic safari experience. As the bush thins and water sources dry up, wildlife congregates around permanent rivers and holes, making them easier to spot.

PRACTICAL TIPS

PACKING ESSENTIALS

- **Neutral Colors:** Wear khaki, beige, or olive to blend in and avoid attracting insects.
- **Layering:** Temperatures swing wildly; bring a warm jacket for dawn drives and light layers for midday.
- **Gear:** Don't forget high-quality binoculars and a camera with a telephoto lens.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- **Malaria:** Check if your destination is a risk area and consult a doctor for prophylaxis.
- **Stay Inside:** Never leave your vehicle unless in designated areas or with a guide.
- **Sun Protection:** The African sun is intense; use high-SPF sunscreen and a wide-brimmed hat.

RESPONSIBLE TOURISM

- **Silence is Golden:** Keep noise levels low to avoid distressing the animals.
- **No Feeding:** Never feed wildlife; it disrupts their natural behavior and can be dangerous.
- **Leave No Trace:** Respect the environment by taking all litter back with you.
