TFVC – Team Foundation Version Control




Software developers have used centralized version control systems since 1970s




In the year 2012...

In 2011-2012, distributed version control started gaining traction, with Git and Mercurial at the lead.







Open Source contributors want you to use their software!







Inner source at Microsoft

High-performing teams thrive when the culture enables inner sourcing - the sharing of knowledge, skills and code inside the organization.

- Changed incentives to encourage sharing
- Made sharing with the org the default
- Support cross-org fork and pull request workflows




