Git: configurations

```
$ git config --global user.name "FirstName LastName"  
$ git config --global user.email "your-email@email-provider.com"  
$ git config --global color.ui true  
$ git config --list
```

Git: starting a repository

```
$ git init  
$ git status
```

Git: staging files

```
$ git add <file-name>  
$ git add <file-name> <another-file-name> <yet-another-file-name>  
$ git add .  
$ git add --all  
$ git add -A  
$ git rm --cached <file-name>  
$ git reset <file-name>
```

Git: committing to a repository

```
$ git commit -m "Add three files"  
$ git reset --soft HEAD^  
$ git commit --amend -m <enter your message>
```
