



The prevalence of ARIA labels and descriptions increased 28% in just the last year. Home pages averaged 25 `aria-label`, `aria-labelledby`, or `aria-describedby` attributes.

79.4% of the one million home pages used ARIA (excluding ARIA landmark roles), up notably from 74.6% in 2024. **Home pages with ARIA present had over twice as many errors (57 on average) than pages without ARIA (27 on average).** While ARIA is intended to improve accessibility, one would expect to encounter an additional 30 potential

§ 2.5 Fifth Rule of ARIA Use

All interactive elements must have an accessible name.

An interactive element only has an accessible name when its Accessibility API *accessible name* (or equivalent) property has a value.

For example, the `input type="text"` in the code example below has a visible label 'user name' , but no accessible name:

user name `<input type="text">`

or

`user name <input type="text">`

aria-live pitfalls?

- don't focus the live region
- don't trigger announcements multiple times, too much is annoying

aria-live why?

- status updates and warnings
are often clearly marked
visually, live regions add it
programmatically

aria-hidden

aria-hidden how?

- not on focusable elements!
- avoid confusing sighted screenreader users

aria-hidden why?

- to remove redundant content from AT (this is likely rare)

aria-hidden is not the
same as role=presentation
(which only removes
default role)

landmarks, aria-expanded, aria-pressed

aria-controls

no consensus on how it is supposed to be conveyed to screenreader users

JAWS exposes it but it is off by default, hidden deep in config

however... this could be used for AT to help users jump into a controlled element?

aria-owns

support (inconsistent; missing in iOS/macOS + VoiceOver)

complex as there are many ways owner or child could be invalid, ways to create cycles or multiple owners

however... it could be useful for AT to know about relationships?

TAKEAWAYS

TAKEAWAYS

ARIA adds semantics, but not behaviour

Incorrect use is often worse than no use

Going the ARIA route can yield subtle bugs in support or consistency of support

There are a couple of things that are safe to use and helpful to end users
