
Who is website accessibility for?

- Search engine bots




Why should I care about website accessibility?

- Differentiate links with theme elements besides color
- Use descriptive link text
- Do not use images for links
- Avoid super short or long links
- Design link focus indicators
- Ensure link text makes sense on. its own




Media

- Use animation, video & audio carefully & selectively
- Avoid flashing/strobing content
- Provide alt ways to access content
- USE ALT TAGS! Be accurate, be succinct, avoid being redundant, avoid "image of" phrases, & use empty alt attributes for decorative images
