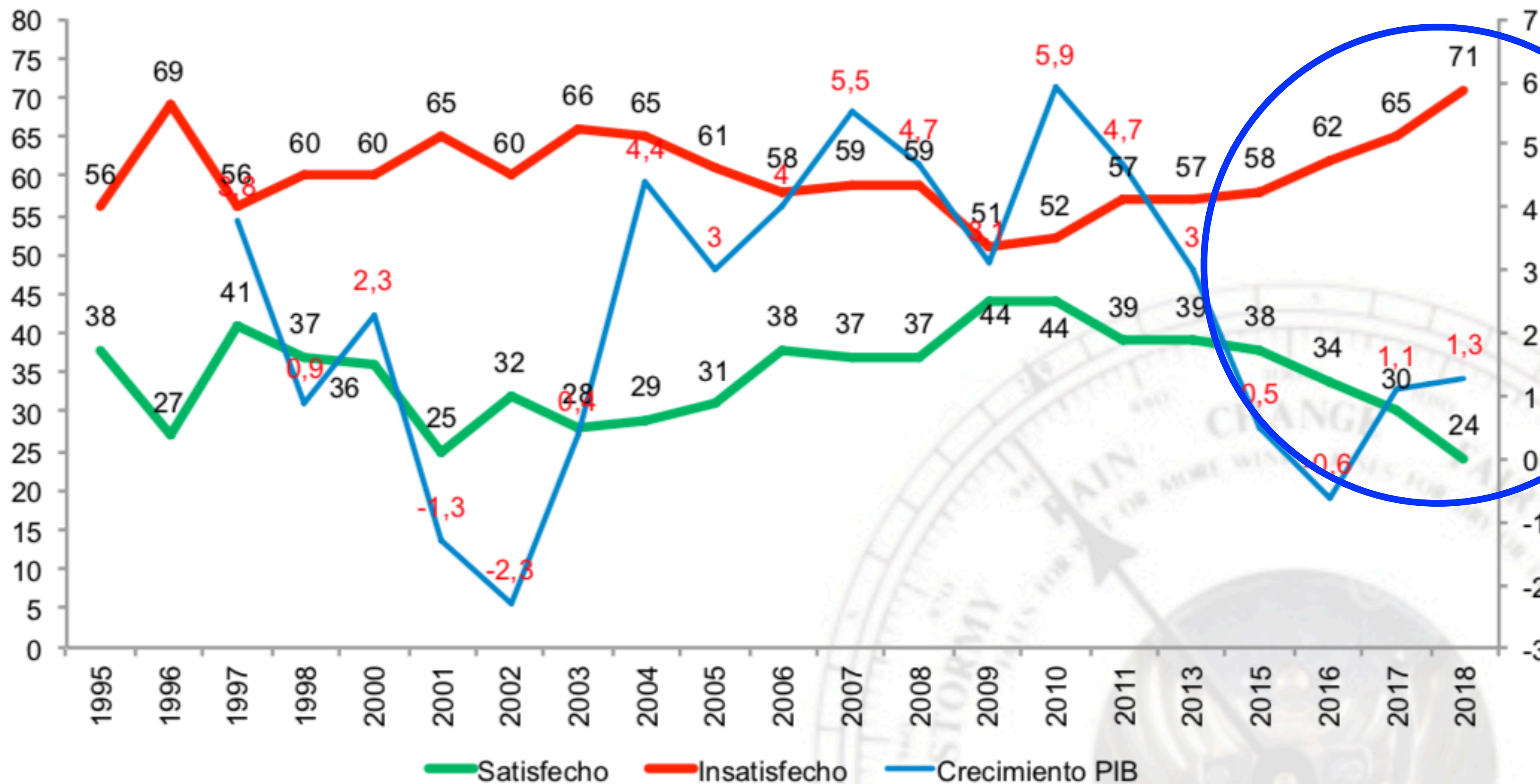

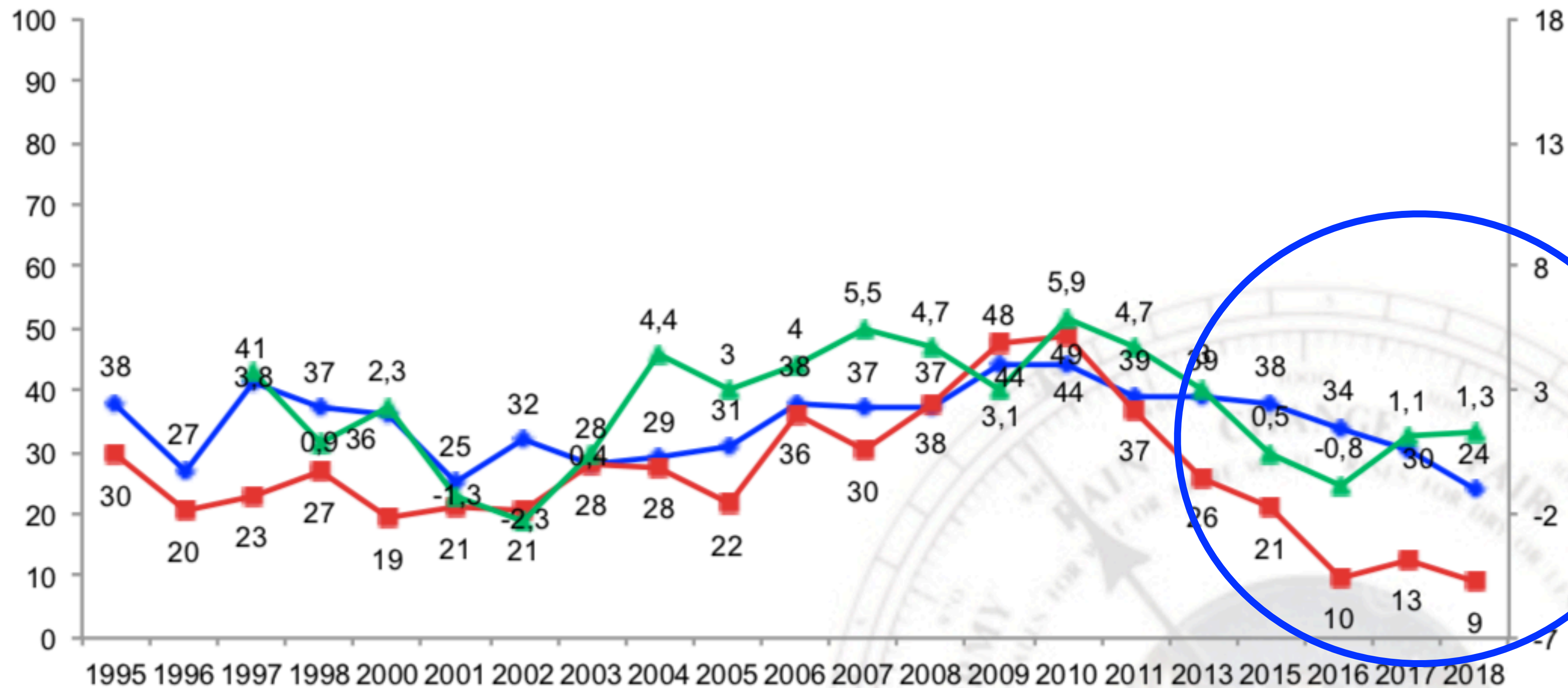


SATISFACCIÓN CON LA DEMOCRACIA

TOTAL LATINOAMÉRICA/ BRASIL 1995 – 2018

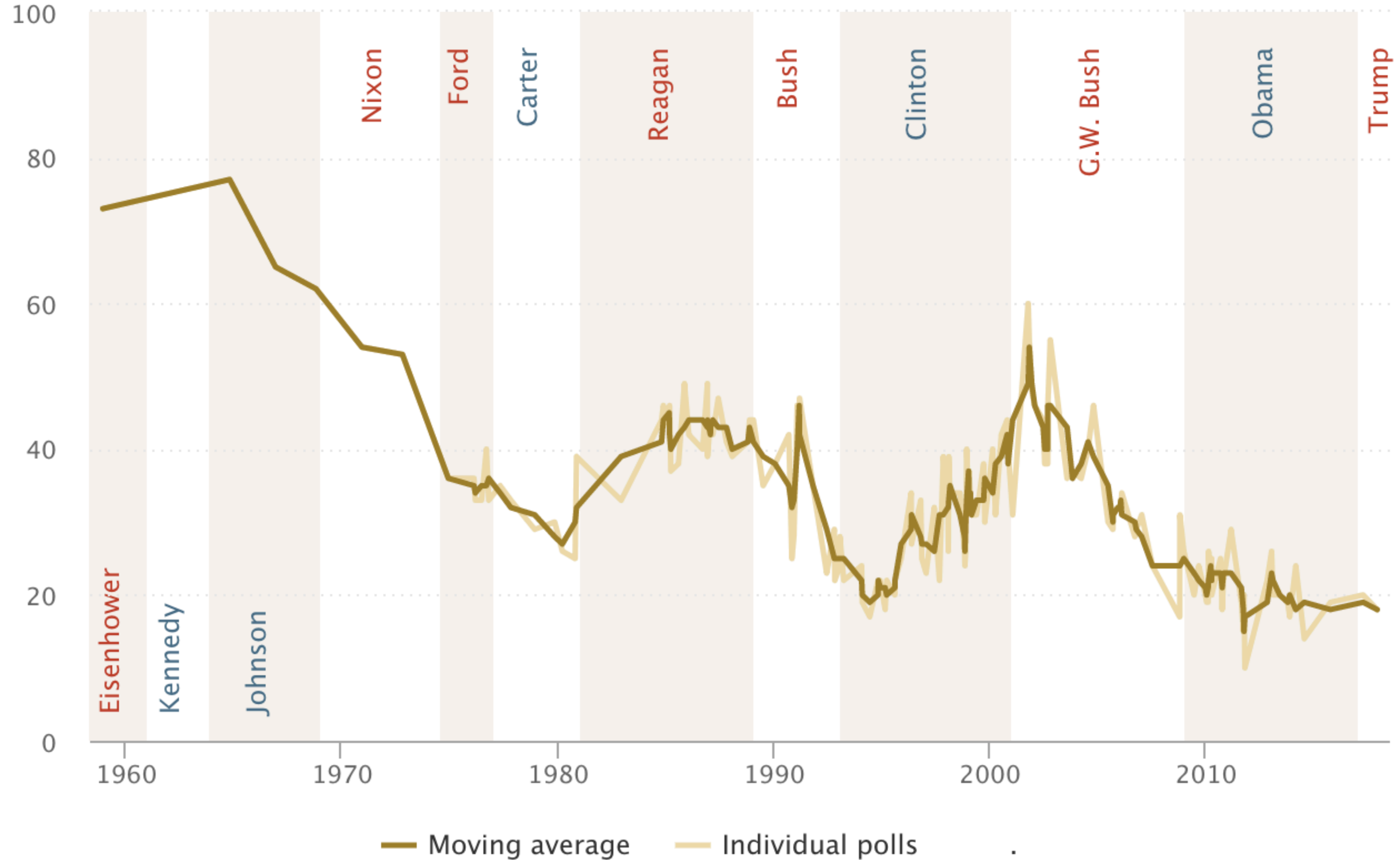

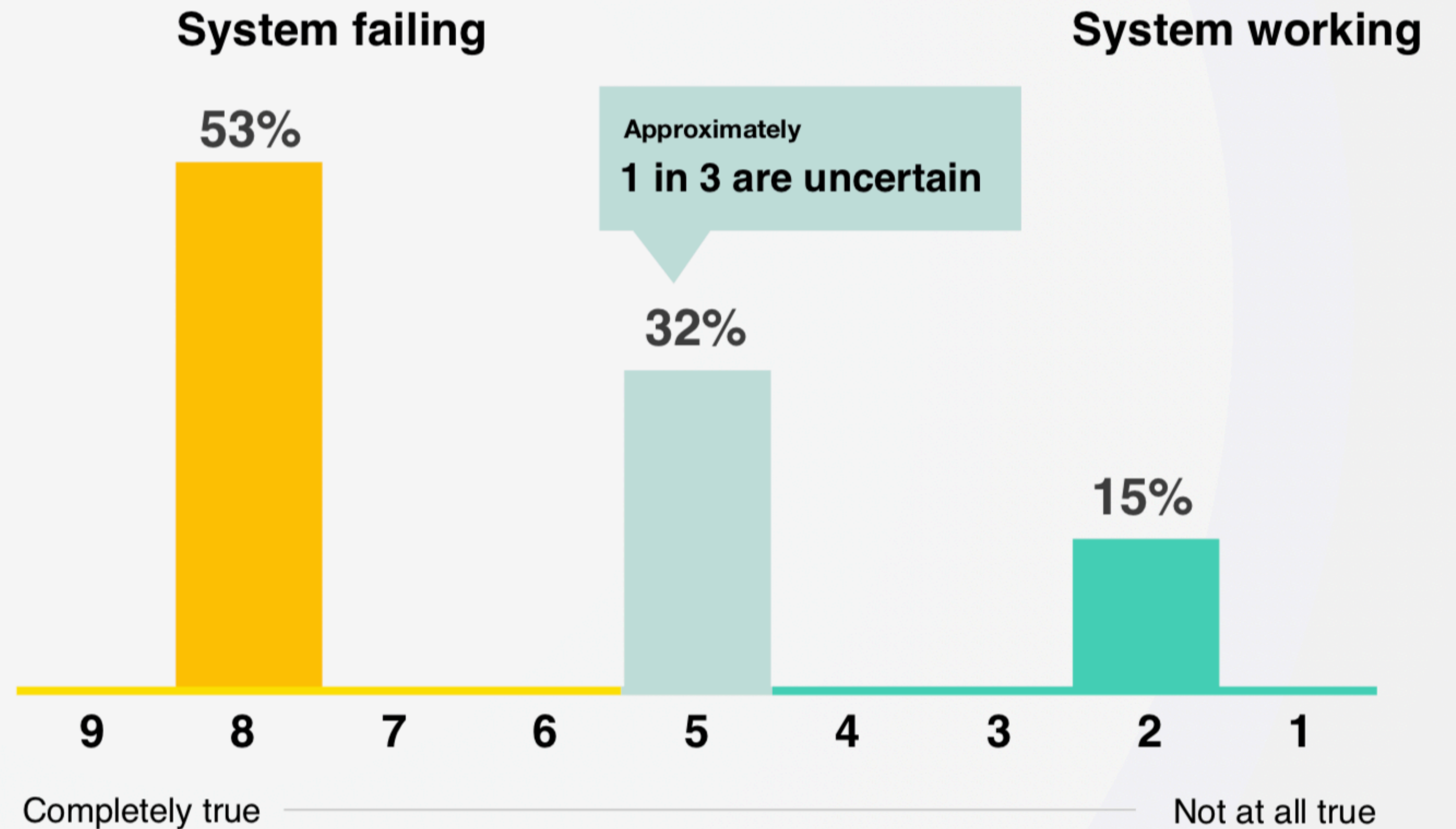

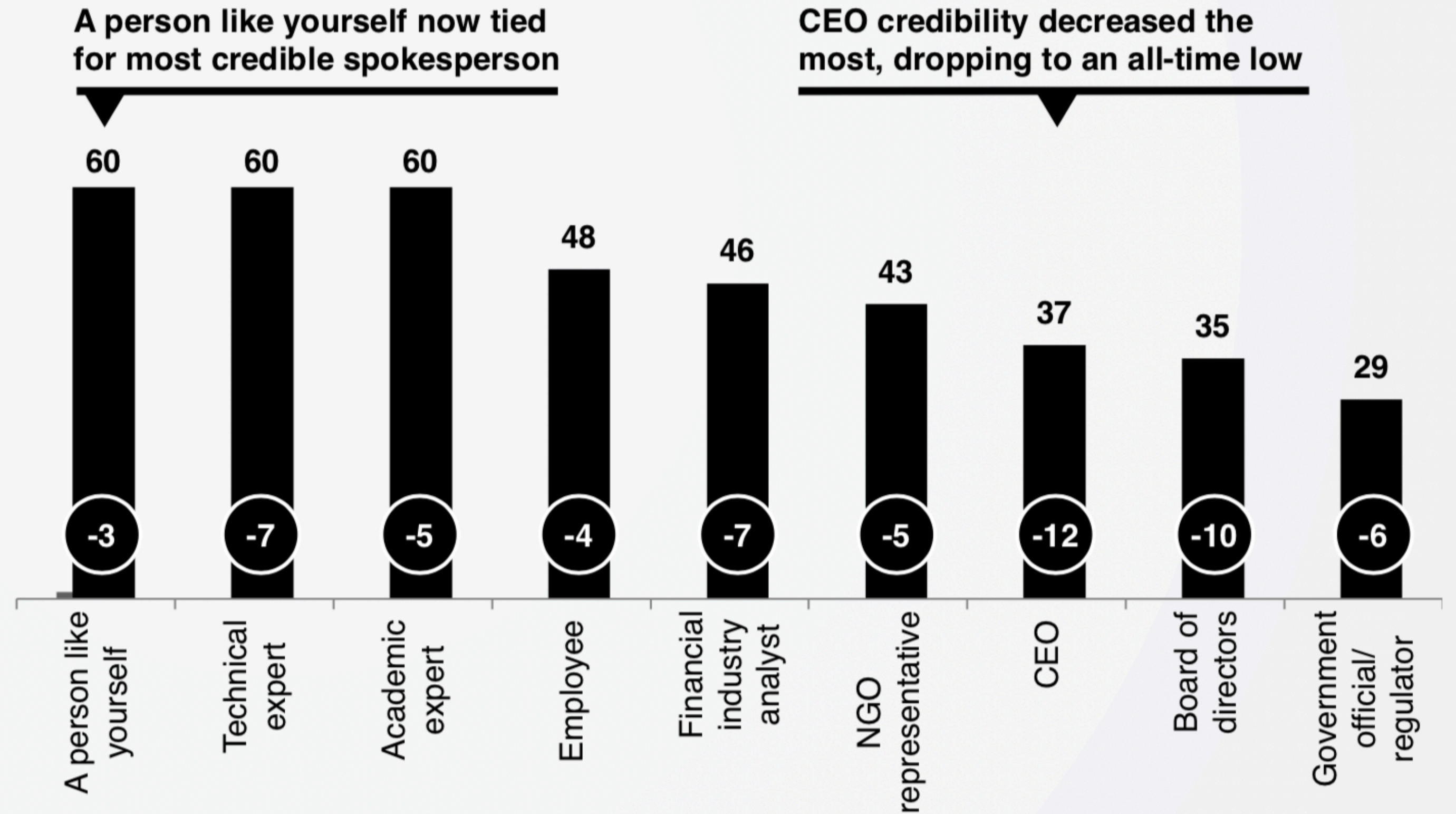
Peers Now as Credible as Experts

Percent who rate each spokesperson as extremely/very credible, and change from 2016 to 2017


