The statistics are very clear.


If I look around in the café at work there are tons of women.

But if I look around me in my little engineering team **there is only one woman.**And I think it is a shame that so few women choose tech and those that do have so many things to fight."





[6] Python Community Pyramid









### Diversity


- Python in Iraq! 50% women



### Python Core Development Mentorship Excerpt

- We ask everyone to be welcoming, friendly, and patient.

First, getting start with awareness of your privileges.


