




What is Livestreaming?

- "Second screen" experience




Reach global audiences at home





Which Platform is Right for Me?


- Do you have an existing audience? Community?

Tips for Streaming Technical Content


- Content first, shiny tech

- Education + Entertainment
- Interact with chat
- Plan, but be flexible





Tips for Streaming Technical Content


- Focus on the "developer loop" of "code, build, test"
- Mistakes, debugging, and learning are okay!
- Post code in a repo






Being a Strong Community Leader

- Create a Code of Conduct/rules
- Use inclusive, welcoming language
- Value community input, but be the final decision maker
- Keep an eye out for bad actors -moderation is key
